



Let's Go! is a two-year expression of our vision to be for the gospel and for the city to expand our reach in Tallahassee and beyond. We are halfway through this season of Let's Go! and we are already seeing this big vision come to life! God is calling us to GO - to our neighbors, our coworkers, our classmates, our friends - to a city that is over-churched and under-reached. So, let's keep going

Leadership Development

Growing our residency and internship programs is also a goal of Let's Go! We want to continue to invest in developing leaders before they are sent out into vocational ministry, or equipped to live on mission in their professional career.

Community

We believe life is better in community, not alone. City Groups are small groups that meet all across our city to study God's word and grow in community. We want to focus on City Groups, with a goal to see 20 new groups launched over the next two years.



The primary mission field for our church is Tallahassee. We want to see every person in our city reached with the good news of the gospel! Here are a few ways we want to expand our gospel reach and be for the city:

Outreach Events

We are more committed than ever to outreach events like Easter at the Civic Center and Christmas On the Moon where we have the chance to leverage cultural holidays for the sake of sharing and proclaiming the gospel in Tallahassee. This is true for our next gen ministries as well with events like Launch at Langford, which is programmed with the goal to reach students on college campuses, and our annual KiDS Camp designed to reach families from all over our city.

Community Partners

We will be increasing our giving to all of our community partners, including a significant increase in financial support to A Women's Pregnancy Center and the Hang Tough Foundation. We want to give more than we ever have to these organizations who are already serving those in need in our city. Every Member on Mission

We want to see every member equipped to live on mission in our city and beyond. We are excited to continue to grow and develop equipping environments like our quarterly Men's Gatherings and Women's Gatherings, designed to do just that!





Although Tallahassee is our primary mission field, it is not our only mission field. God has called us to take the gospel to those who have never heard it. Here are a couple of ways Let's Go! will allow us to participate in the command to make disciples of all nations:

Salt Network

We want to increase our involvement with church planting in university cities by not only continuing our partnership with The Salt Network, but also planting a Salt Network church in a college town in the next couple of years. There are over 400 major universities across North America. Through the Salt Network, we pray we will see a thriving church and college ministry established in all of these major university centers. Through Let's Go! we will increase our financial support to the network as well as fund the Salt Company college ministry here at City Church.





Missions Partners

We want to increase our giving to missions during this season! Every year we support the International Mission Board (IMB) and the North American Mission Board (NAMB) through both the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering and the Annie Armstrong Easter Offering. During Let's Go!, we plan to make our largest gifts ever to both of these offerings to support missions work here and abroad.

Sending

We want to create more short, medium and long-term missions opportunities that you, our church family, can be part of. Because of this, we have recently made key hires so we can see more people equipped to be sent to the nations.

Redeemer Queen's Park

Let's Go! will allow us to continue participating in the command to make disciples of all nations by helping to directly fund Redeemer Church in London, England. London is a global city comprised of more than 11 million people, who speak more than 300 languages. Taking the gospel to London takes it to the world.





HOW DID YOU GET CONNECTED TO CITY CHURCH?

I got connected to City Church through a few friends living in my freshman-year dorm. They had attended a summer event that, at that time, City Church U hosted to welcome freshmen. When I arrived in the fall, I was in a place in my faith where I felt that I could do the Christian life alone. However, through this, I came to a point where God was not at all at the center of my mind and I was more focused on chasing the world and its temporary glory, rather than chasing Jesus. So, coincidentally, I met and became friends with them, and upon finding out where I was in my faith, they encouraged me to attend Launch @ Langford. So, after their encouragement, I decided to attend.



WHAT DID YOU THINK WHEN YOU WALKED UP TO LAUNCH @ LANGFORD?

When I first walked up to Launch, I was shocked to see hundreds of college students covering Langford Green, all with the goal of worshiping God. Students with different grades, backgrounds, schools, and life goals, all gathered together for one mission. There were people who were excited that I was there and excited to meet me and welcome me into the community. I could not help but think to myself, "There is something different about these people."

WHAT HAPPENED OUT OF THAT EVENT? WHAT NEXT STEPS DID YOU TAKE?

At that event, I heard the gospel preached clearly and concisely. I felt surrounded by people who truly cared about the gospel and believed in what it meant for their lives. In that moment, my eyes were opened to my need to be in Christian community and a body of believers that took the Bible seriously and reached the college campus seriously. There was no other response to what God was showing me and teaching me that night than to join a City Group and take fellowship seriously.

TELL US A LITTLE BIT ABOUT YOUR LIFE BEFORE KNOWING JESUS AND HOW IT LOOKS DIFFERENT NOW.

I grew up in church all my life and my parents were fantastic at stressing the importance of Spiritual Discipline. However, I fell into a lukewarmness where I knew intellectually what I should do, but I did not let my life and actions be truly changed by the implications of the gospel. That was until I realized, the gospel DEMANDS a response and that some changes needed to be made. God used City Church and the people in it to disciple and teach me what it looks like to follow Christ. This is a multigenerational church that believes in following Jesus into the world, not just being a cruise ship

for believers, but a battleship for the mission. Every ministry at City Church from SALT, to Students, to discipleship has worked together to grow me in my faith and what it looks like to serve and be a part of the living body of Christ.

TELL US ABOUT RESIDENCY. WHAT MINISTRY DO YOU SERVE IN NOW & WHY?

I serve City Church as a Resident in the college ministry, Salt Company. In my time attending FSU, God broke my heart for the college campus and showed me the need for the gospel in the lives of these young adults. City Church joined the SALT Network, which is a network of churches that are based in strategic college campus cities, with the goal of impacting those campuses with the good news. We are committed to the verse, Luke 10:2 which talks about the harvest being plentiful and the laborers that we need to both pray for and be. So, when I decided I wanted to do a residency after graduation, I could not think of any better area for me and my convictions, than the college ministry!



GROWING IN GENEROSITY

In Matthew 6, Jesus says, where your money is, there your heart will be also. We want to see everyone who calls this church home growing more like Jesus. If we are growing in Christ we should also be growing in generosity. We believe that Christian generosity begins with giving to the local church and that every Christian should have a plan to support their local church. Whether you are considering giving for the first time, or you have faithfully given for years, we believe there is a step you can take to grow in generosity. As we grow in generosity, we not only increase our giving, but also our Kingdom impact. We want to equip you to grow in generosity, so we've put together this guide to help you along the way.

FIRST TIME - *I* am giving for the first time. Growing in generosity always begins with a first step. Taking that first step is never easy, but required if you are going to grow. If you have never given before, take your first step by giving today.

OCCASIONAL - I have given before, but not

consistently. If you have given something in the past, but done so inconsistently, oftentimes your next step is to begin giving regularly. A great way to move from giving occasionally to giving consistently is to set up a recurring gift.

CONSISTENT - I give consistently, but not as much

as I could. The consistent giver has taken steps to give regularly. They are committed to the act of giving. At this stage, our next step of growing in generosity is to give in a way that reflects the generosity we have been shown through Christ. A next step to grow in generosity is to evaluate the level at which you are giving.

TITHING - *I faithfully give 10% of my income*. Tithing simply is giving back the first 10% of what God has given us. The tithing giver has gone from giving consistently to giving intentionally in a way that models a heart of generosity. Growing in generosity means looking for additional ways to further God's Kingdom with your resources.

SACRIFICIAL - I give more than 10%, prioritizing

God's Kingdom over mine. The sacrificial giver is someone who gives beyond what is normal or accepted. When we grow into sacrificial giving, we begin to choose God's Kingdom over our own comforts. The sacrificial giver shows the transforming work Jesus has done in our lives by giving in a way that impacts their lifestyle.

LEGACY - I give to make a Kingdom impact that

outlasts me. The legacy giver believes that every resource, whether financial or otherwise, is a gift from God to be used for His Kingdom purposes. The legacy giver intentionally gives by acknowledging that their generosity will outlast them, and that everything in their life is to be freely and generously given for God's work. Legacy giving leaves an impact that outlasts the giver and serves the Kingdom beyond their lives.

What is Let's Go!?

Let's Go! is a two-year expression of our vision to be for the gospel and for the city, to expand our reach in Tallahassee and beyond. It includes a two-year financial commitment to accomplish this faith-stretching, exciting vision, and we are asking you to go with us.

Why is the project called Let's Go!?

Besides our Lead Pastor's love for Tom Brady, the campaign is called Let's Go! because we believe that is exactly what God is calling each of us to do over the next two years. City Church started with a vision to be for the gospel and for the city. That vision has not changed, it has grown. We know that it takes all of us going – from our church, for the city, and to the world - to make that vision possible. God is calling us to go – so LET'S GO!

How much will the facility expansion and renovation cost?

The current estimate for the building expansion and renovation is approximately \$12,200,000. Of that figure we anticipate using \$2,200,000 from strategic reserves, \$5,000,000 raised during Let's Go!, and financing the remaining \$5,000,000.

• Are there phases to this expansion?

The construction will be completed in stages, but there are not multiple phases to this expansion. We will begin by building a new auditorium, lobby, and administrative spaces. Once complete, we will renovate the current auditorium into a medium-sized auditorium and small group rooms for Students. Upon completion of that stage, the current KiDS space and a portion of the original lobby and auditorium will be converted into a new and expanded KiDS ministry space. During the construction, we are planning to continue meeting in our current space, and not needing to relocate during the construction and renovation. This is in part due to the ability to work being completed in each stage. Some ministry operations may change locations during the construction, but we plan to remain on campus during that time.



Why should I consider giving to Let's GO!?

Giving to Let's Go! looks similar to your regular giving to the church, just more focused and expanded to help catalyze this season of growth. As Christians and local church members, we want to obey the Scriptures and obey the call to give to the local church. In giving to the local church, you are financially supporting the expansion of God's kingdom here in Tallahassee, and around the world. Giving to Let's Go! allows us to go from our church, for the city and to the world. Your giving helps us proclaim the Gospel in the city of Tallahassee, continue making disciples, and allows us to expand our facilities to create a more adequate environment for the mission God has called us to. Additionally, giving to Let's Go! continues to support all of the ministry that is happening at City Church that you know and love.

Why do churches talk about money, finances, and giving so much?

We believe that it is important to talk about money, finances, and giving because Jesus tells us that where our treasure is, there our heart will be also. We have a desire to be people who are committed to living lives that glorify the Lord. We also want to make sure that we are not greedy or ungodly in the way that we handle our possessions. We believe the local church is God's "Plan A" for reaching the world with the good news of the gospel and that every Christian should have a plan to support their local church. We talk about money, finances, and giving because we care about our hearts and acknowledge that everything we have has been given to us freely by him.

How do I know that this church is a trustworthy place to give my resources?

We seek to use the resources that are given to City Church in the most God-honoring ways possible. A few steps that we have taken to ensure that you can have confidence in the way we handle the resources given to City Church are: We are accredited by the Evangelical Council for Financial Accountability (ECFA). As members of the ECFA, we uphold their 7 Standards for Financial Accountability. To view those standards, visit ecfa.org. Additionally, we have our financial statements audited annually by an independent third party accounting firm. We also desire to be transparent in how we plan to spend and allocate resources, so our budget is available at citychurchletsgo.com.



• Are we financially healthy as a church?

Yes. We are, by God's grace and the generosity of many of you, in a very financially healthy position. We currently have more than 6 months of operating reserves, and 12 months of debt service reserves. According to prominent CPAs in the non-profit sector, these measures as well as others give us a strong financial position. As we move into this project we are committed to retaining those reserves and holding a sound financial position into the future.

• How can families participate?

This is a great opportunity to get your children involved and excited about the mission and vision of our church, and the work God is doing in Tallahassee and beyond. For our preschool and elementary age kids, we have put together a Family Guidebook with weekly devotionals, conversation guides, and more to help you follow along as a family! We also have family discussion guestions in our 2023 Guidebook!

• How are we seeking the Lord's guidance in these efforts?

Through every step of this process, we have sought prayer, wise counsel, and looked at the scriptures to make sure the decisions being made are honoring the Lord and working to build His church. Every effort put forth is carefully prayed through, thought through, and decided on by our staff team and our elders, as we seek to be good stewards of what the Lord has given us. We also ask that you pray with us throughout this season. We've included a weekly Bible reading plan and prayer guide later in this book that we invite you to follow along with! This is a big vision, and we know that we are dependent on the Lord to make it a reality.



• Can I donate real estate, stocks/bonds, and other stored assets?

Yes, you can include stored assets in your Let's Go! giving plan. Most of the wealth owned by Christians is in the form of non-cash assets, yet most of the giving to churches is in the form of cash, NOT assets. For some, there can be great advantages to giving from assets instead of cash. What is a Commitment Card?

The giving period for Let's Go! is November 13, 2022 - December 2024. For those of you joining in at the halfway point, the giving period will begin November 2023 and will go through December 2024

WHAT TRIPS DID YOU PARTICIPATE IN?

I went to Berlin during spring break and London in the summer of 2023! The bulk of both trips was mainly focused on prayer walking and evangelizing. In Berlin, we got to serve local church leaders through preparing a meal and participating in a 10k hike as they were ministering and building relationships with their non-believing friends. In London, we got to have so much wisdom shared with us from Redeemer's church leaders about how they have leveraged their lives for the sake of taking the gospel to the Nations. My favorite moments of the Berlin trip were definitely seeing how the Lord used our team to encourage each other and the missionaries/church planters serving in the city - all while sleep deprived, not knowing the language and navigating a completely different culture. In a few days, we got to share the gospel with nearly 15 people, which is about 10 more people than any of the local missionaries were expecting!

WHAT MADE YOU DECIDE TO GO?

When Thomas West (Pastor at Redeemer QP in London) came and spoke at City Church in 2019, he shared how he felt the Lord calling him from NC to London to start a church plant. I was in college at the time and he was speaking on a Tuesday night. He opened up the scriptures to show us how the Lord has commanded us to be a part of the great commission and to bring the gospel to the Nations. I immediately felt like I wanted to be a part of that too. I wasn't anticipating going to Berlin, but when I heard pastor Craig talking about what the city was like and how desperate the people are there for the gospel, I knew I had to go and see for myself. I wanted to take part in sharing the good news with Berliners.

HOW HAS YOUR FAITH GROWN SINCE GOING?

I didn't realize how much I had been neglecting evangelizing in my personal life and how much that was impacting my faith. The minute I got back, it was like I was seeing every conversation differently - an opportunity to bring Life into every discussion. I used to think of evangelism just as a means to bring Life to others- but what I experienced was that it ALSO brought Life to me! It is a beautiful thing what the Lord shows you if you're willing to be obedient. You don't just preach the gospel to yourself by sitting alone with your Bible, you preach the gospel to yourself from hearing it as you share it with others.

WHAT WOULD YOU SAY TO SOMEONE WHO IS THINKING ABOUT GOING?

Let's Go! I understand the commitment may seem daunting; but the time will pass anyway, the money will go someplace anyway. We all know the feeling of, "wow the summer flew by!" Or "my vacation went too quick!" Why not use the time to do something you won't be able to help BUT remember what you were doing! After all, our time and money don't belong to us anyway. What a sweet way to offer up these gifts back to God. Also - you're not in this alone! City Church wants to come alongside you and help you through this process. Just reach out!

IS THERE ANYTHING ELSE YOU WANT TO SHARE WITH US ABOUT YOUR EXPERIENCE?

After going on these trips, I really feel the Lord stirring in my heart a LOVE for the lost and for the Nations. We know that Jesus Himself had a love for the lost and for the Nations (Luke 19:10, Matthew 28:19). God used this experience to make me more like Jesus. What a precious gift!

OBSERVE —

Last week we talked about the cost of following Jesus. Why is it essential that we have brothers and sisters unified in the gospel alongside us?

Looking at verses 20-26, what does Paul say about both the Jews and Gentiles in relation to the unity found in Christ?

Looking at verse 28, who stirred up the crowd against Paul and what was the accusation presented? As a result of this accusation, what happens to Paul?

INTERPRET ----

Compare Acts 21:20-26 with 1 Corinthians 9:15-23. Are Paul's actions and his missionary policy consistent? Paul is living out the words he wrote in Galatians 5:13-15. Read through this passage - what does it look like to "serve one another through love?"

On the contrary, what does it look like to "bite and devour one another" in the context of the church? Read Philippians 1:27-29. What does this passage teach us about where our unity is found as Christians?

APPLY —

Paul was willing to bend over backwards for the church in Jerusalem in order to preserve the unity of the church. How important is the unity of City Church to you? What are some things you can do to help foster unity in the church?

In view of this, in our own lives and in the life of the church, how do we discern between non-negotiables and preferences?

What does it mean to defend the faith? When might you need to do this?

One of the main missions of Let's Go! is to take the gospel news to those in our city. Take a few moments to pray for God to help you present the gospel this week. Ask God to bring your hearers to faith in Christ.

FAMILY DISCUSSION

What ultimately unites us as believers in the church?

Prompt kids to realize that believers are united in Jesus through the Holy Spirit. God gathers people who have faith in Jesus and invites us into His family. We are like the parts of one body—the church—and Jesus is the head of the church. He holds the whole universe together, and He unites us. (1 Corinthians 1:12-13)

How can you proactively live "For the Gospel, for the City"?
